You'll need to go through your school district to reserve buses and substitutes. SMILE will cover these costs by reimbursing the district.

Waivers and Registrations





PLEASE NOTE: Students must be registered as SMILE members in Ideal-Logic to attend the Challenge. The registration cutoff is Jan. 30.

Waivers: Each teacher, chaperone, and student attending a Challenge event must complete an OSU liability waiver. Chaperones will need to complete an OSU background check as well. If the student is under 18, a parent or guardian signature is required. Waivers can be found in the Challenge Google Drive folder, link below. (A Spanish version of the waiver will be posted soon). To turn in completed waivers, you can print them off and either bring the physical copies to the Winter Teacher Workshop, or scan them/take photos and upload them to your club's folder in the Challenge Google Drive folder. Teachers attending the Winter Teacher Workshop are welcome to sign their individual waiver at that time.

Registration: Each Club will complete a registration form that will be made available in mid February. When available, this will also be located in the Google Drive folder (link below).

All waivers and registrations must be received by Friday, March 24.

Reminder: Students cannot attend the event unless they are registered in Ideal-Logic, they have completed a liability waiver, and they are included on the registration form.
